Reflection of the Week

An Intense Prayer

When faced with trials, unbelievers, like the widow in 1 Kings 17, often shake their fists at God. Sometimes, they make one of God's people, even someone close to them, the target of their anger. The widow says to Elijah, "What do you have against me, man of God? Did you come to remind me of my sin and kill my son?" (v. 18).

Elijah responds the way every Christian should: He does not return the anger but goes to God in prayer, relying on God's power to change the circumstances. God then uses Elijah to achieve the first resurrection in the Bible. God does this historical miracle in the home of a Baal-worshiping

widow in the lowliest of places. It is a lesson that when we pray and depend on God's power, He will pour His resurrection power on the people and plans in our lives.

Elijah's intensity in prayer for the boy was effective as he literally puts his entire being into intercession. God honours this type of wholehearted devotion in prayer.

Elijah also does not hesitate to ask God, "LORD my God, have you brought tragedy even on this widow I am staying with, by causing her son to die?" (v. 20). Asking God "why" is not wrong. Gideon did it when faced with the Midianites. Job asked, "Why?" when tragedy struck his life. Even Jesus cried out to His Father from the cross: "Why?" Yet they all knew that God is all-powerful and can restore health, life, and victory.

With the resurrection of her son, the widow finally comes to know God. She responds, "Now I know that you are a man of God and that the word of the LORD from your mouth is the truth" (v. 24).

Does Elijah's intensity in prayer inspire you?

Prayer: God, help me to pray with the kind of intensity with which Elijah prayed, believing that You will answer. Help me to devote more time, passion, and purpose to my prayer life. I pray in the name of Jesus. Amen.

"So he left them and went away once more and prayed the third time, saying the same thing" (Matthew 26:44).

Prayer Points for This Week

For Our Church:

- Pray for a deeper trust in God's promise of eternal peace through Jesus Christ as we wait with hope this second Sunday of Advent.
- Pray for hearts to discover true contentment in every situation, drawing strength from Christ.
- Pray for preachers, worship leaders, musicians, sound teams, and all who serve during this Advent season, that they may be guided and strengthened by God.
- Pray for healing and restoration for those in need.

For the Wider Church:

- Pray for churches without ministers, seeking God's guidance, provision, and unity. Ask for the right leaders to be raised up and for strength as these churches continue their mission.
- Pray for the Christmas Bowl ministry to bring hope and peace to those in need. Ask for generosity to overflow during this season and for God's wisdom to guide those serving through this work.

- Pray for schools to be safe and supportive spaces for students and staff. Lift up Christian religious education teachers and students, asking for growth in faith and boldness in sharing the good news of Jesus Christ.
- Pray for the International Mission Board, Gospel for Asia, The AIDS Orphans Project, and their missionaries. May they be effective in spreading the gospel and sharing Christ's love across the world.

For Australia:

- Pray for individuals and families facing mental health challenges, especially those worsened by isolation, financial difficulties, and other pressures.
- Pray for Indigenous communities in Australia, asking for wisdom and unity in reconciliation efforts. Pray for positive role models for children, improvements in education, and lasting solutions to issues like drug use and abuse.
- Pray for a spiritual awakening across Australia, asking God to draw hearts closer to Him and inspire a renewed commitment to prayer and His Word.
- Pray for the government to develop and implement policies that effectively reduce the harm caused by gambling and help communities affected by its impact.

For the World:

- Pray for world leaders to lead with wisdom, justice, and compassion, seeking solutions that foster peace and cooperation among nations.
- Pray for relief and aid to reach those suffering in Yemen and South Sudan, where conflict has led to extreme shortages of food, water, and medical care.
- Pray for the safety and courage of journalists and activists in nations like Russia, China, and Mexico, as they face threats and persecution for standing up for truth and justice.
- Pray for a global revival of faith, asking that hearts around the world turn to God with renewed hope and trust in His promises.
